Attention Handgun Members!

Your new club "ATT" Permit (Authorization to Transport) is in and as always, it is only given out once your membership dues have been received. For those who do not renew your membership on time, your "ATT" will be returned to the Chief Firearms Office in Orillia for cancellation. This is not our choice, but a requirement by the CFO that a person holding an "ATT" must be a member in good standing (current paid-up member) of a recognized club.

While we are on the subject of permits and licences, please take a moment and check the expiry date on your "PAL" (*Possession and Acquisition*) licence. Although the CFO should send you a reminder 3 months before it expires, do not wait for their application. Download one, ask the CFO for one, or phone our office for one. Do not let your licence expire!

Our Office Hi-Tech Advancements!

Along with the move of our office to a great new location, we had our new telephone system and office equipment moved over without incident, as well as taking the opportunity to upgrade our security system. We have also taken the opportunity to upgrade the Office computer, as well as our Classroom computer.

The classroom laptop computer which was graciously donated to us a while ago has served us well until just recently. With the addition of our new LCD Projector system, and the need to put videos on the computer instead of wheeling out the Television/VCR combination, we have found the graphics, and capacity of the old laptop computer was lacking. So, we took the opportunity of upgrading to a new Dell laptop which should serve us well for now, and well into the future.

This new classroom computer is used for the courses TSA offers, such as Hunter's Education Course, FAC Course, and Handgun Safety Course. It provides a pleasant, cleaner on-screen viewing experience for the students, as well as an enjoyable, easier to use platform for the Instructors. This will also allow us to convert some of the videos, and transfer them to the computer, thus eliminating the need for the television and VCR. The new system will make all the present and future courses appear more seamless, and without interruptions. In addition to this, the classroom computer is now connected wirelessly to the Internet which would allow classroom instructors to show items live from the Internet, as well as updating software online.



In addition to the Classroom computer needs, we have just upgraded Yvonne's office computer to a new Dell system. After shopping around, we found one of their particular models would suit the club's needs just fine for now, and into the future. It also includes wireless Internet connectivity for our Club's Database, Internet and Email needs. This particular unit also included an Energy Efficient LCD monitor which is much easier on the eyes, as well as more efficient to operate. Because of these new computers having wireless networking technology, a Wireless Router was also added. This will allow us in the future to add additional computers if needed, and move any of them around without being tied down with cables. For both of these computers, we were able to take advantage of the recent low prices, as well as a special online Dell sale.

Our future plans are to re-format and cleanup the older computers, reinstall necessary software, and make them available for use as additional office computers, or student terminals if needed.
