Some PAL Renewal Pointers

I recently renewed my PAL online. The PAL renewal webpage is impossible to navigate without assistance. Having successfully navigated the webpage, I want to share some pointers. It is my hope that these pointers will assist others:

- 1. Nowhere listed on the RCMP webpage is the telephone number for assistance. The assistance number is: 1-800-731-4000.
- 2. When inserting the current PAL number, only use the first eight digits. (Using all of the PAL digits will not work).
- 3. The date of birth calendar changes the date of birth on insertion. Ensure that the date of birth is corrected, prior to approving. (This can be done manually).
- 4. The expiry date for credit card payments does not have an oblique line. Therefore, June 2015 would read: 0615.
- 5. Each extension of time counts as an attempt, and one is only allowed 7 attempts prior to being locked out. Restarting, rather than extending time, may be advisable.
- 6. Only a digital copy (no physical copies) of one's picture is necessary for the online PAL renewal. The specifications for the picture are located in Section 5.6 of the instructions. The specifications are not identical to a passport picture. (I was able to get an accepted digital photograph from: Decal Gallery, 734 Wilson Avenue, Unit 1).

If I had had these pointers prior to starting my PAL renewal, my trip would have been less difficult. It is my hope that sharing these pointers will ease the journey for others.

If there is to be any deviation from this format it is solely at the discretion of the R.O. in charge, and divergence from this will have to be cleared with the R.O. by the Member wishing to fire any additional rounds on target following the above Commands.

Safety on the Range – Painful Brass!

(I published this in 'The Outdoor Crest' 5 years ago, but thought it warranted repeating!)

It is every member's responsibility to ensure that all shooters, as well as guests, are properly protected on the range with safety equipment such as safety glasses and ear protection. This basic equipment is a requirement whether the person is shooting, or just a visitor that is watching the excitement!

Something that may not come as common sense as far as safety equipment goes, is the use of open-toed shoes or sandals, and low cut tops. Whether shooting or not, the ejection of hot brass *(especially the small .22 caliber brass casings)*, can cause quite a burn to the skin if it happens to land in-between some toes, or down an open top. You must also be aware of glasses without the added protection on the top and sides, as ejected brass can slip in and rest on your eyelid causing a burn *(ask me how I know that)!*

Try to remember to mention these safety items to any guests you may have coming with you. We want everyone to have a Fun and Safe time out!

I would also like to repeat that none of the great times this coming year would be possible without all of our volunteer Range Safety Officers, generously donating their time and experience for us to safely enjoy the sport we love.
